#### In Memoriam: Dr. Ned H. Cassem



We are sad to share the news that **Dr. Ned** H. Cassem, former chief of Psychiatry at the Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) and supporter of the Schwartz Center, passed away on July 4, 2015. Dr. Cassem, who cared for patients at the MGH for 40 years, was Ken Schwartz's psychiatrist during Ken's cancer illness. Dr. Cassem was an active board member who personified the importance of the patient-caregiver relationship. We remember Dr. Cassem the way that Ken Schwartz memorialized him in his Boston Globe Magazine article, A Patient's Story: "I felt warmed in his presence, by his wisdom, his common sense, and his spirituality." Dr. Cassem's presence will stay with all of us who
