Compassion in Action: A Q&A with Jon DuBois, MD

We caught up with **Dr. Jon DuBois**, medical director of the Mass General Cancer Center at Emerson Hospital-Bethke, for his thoughts on what inspired him to pursue a career in medicine, why compassionate care matters, the difference the Schwartz Center Rounds® makes for caregivers, and advice for young clinicians interested in medicine and patient care.
