# New White Papers on the Patient-Caregiver Relationship

The Schwartz Center has <u>released</u> two new white papers that address current issues affecting the patient-caregiver relationship. The first white paper, <u>The Impact of Healthcare Cost Controls on the Patient-Caregiver</u> <u>Relationship</u>, is based on our <u>New York Thought Leadership Breakfast</u> conducted in partnership with NewYorkBIO, where the session focused on rising healthcare costs and the role of physicians in educating patients and families about treatment costs.

The second white paper, *Overcoming the Stigma of Mental Illness to* <u>Ensure Compassionate Care for Patients and Families</u>, highlights the major themes that emerged from our recent <u>Health Policy Breakfast</u> in Boston, including the importance of caregiver partnerships with patients' families and education as the key to fighting stigmatization.

## Schwartz Center Membership Survey Results

We recently conducted a survey to learn from our <u>Schwartz</u> <u>Center members</u>. A few highlights:

However, at 33 years old, she was beginning to feel nervous about the prospects of having a child.
