The National Human Trafficking Hotline (NHTH) is another resource available to you. It is a national anti-trafficking hotline serving people who are experiencing trafficking and the anti-trafficking community in the United States. NHTH provides:

- Comprehensive service referrals for potential victims of human trafficking
- Tip reporting to trained law enforcement, when applicable
- Data and trends on human trafficking in the United States

Anyone can call the hotline at any time. It is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, every day of the year. **Text HELP to 233733 (BEFREE)** or call **1–888–373–7888** to get help for potential victims of human trafficking or connect with local services.
