Shame is part of healthcare, and yet it so often goes unnamed. For this very special Compassion in Action webinar on **November 18, 4:00 – 5:00 PM ET**, we've teamed up with [The Nocturnists](#) medical storytelling organization to introduce their latest project, [Shame in Medicine: The Lost Forest](#), to the Schwartz Center community.

During this important conversation, **Emily Silverman, MD**, an internist and host/creator of The Nocturnists, will moderate a panel discussion with shame researcher **Will Bynum, MD**, associate professor of family medicine at Duke University School of Medicine, director of the Duke Family Medicine Residency Program and co-producer of The Nocturnists' Shame in Medicine; **Tina McDowell, RN**, emergency medicine nurse leader and educator; and **Uchenna C. Ewulonu, MD**, assistant professor of pediatrics at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine and pediatric hospitalist and associate program director at Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago. They've courageously shared their stories of shame on The Nocturnists' new 10-part documentary podcast series and will discuss them further with us during this session.

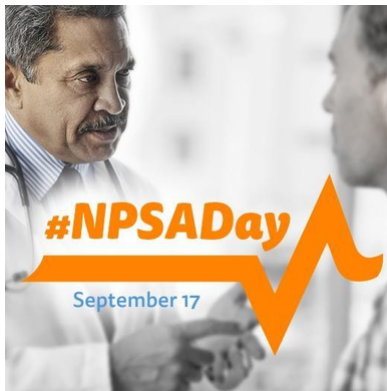

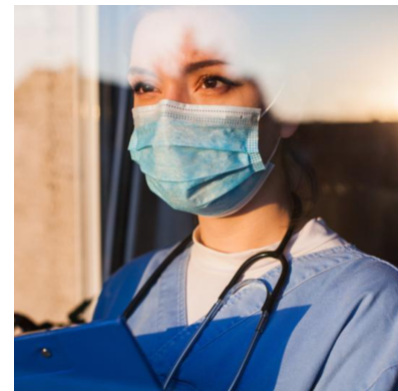
